Candy/Chip Bag Sewing Supplies by Cindy Morgan

MATERIALS

- Candy or chip bag (larger size bags are easier to make when learning)
- Pellon Vinyl Fuse or HeatnBond Iron-On Vinyl (gloss or matte) We will provide.
- 1 plastic tooth zipper longer than the side of the bag you choose to sew it on. No metal tooth zippers.
- □ Cotton fabric for bag lining
- Quilt batting (I prefer Pellon-Thermolam Plus TP970.)
- Thread: color for quilting bag & sewing seams
- □ Scissors for cutting fabric and paper
- Rotary cutter for fabric and opt. for paper

- □ Rotary cutting mat
- □ Straight edge ruler longer than bag
- □ Iron
- □ Ironing surface: mat, small board, etc.
- □ Straight pins
- □ Glue stick (like an Elmer's glue stick)
- □ Tool for pushing out corners of bag
- □ Clips (like the Clover Wonder Clips)
- □ Sewing machine, cord, foot pedal
- Sewing machine Quilting Guide Bar (opt.)
- □ Clover Chaco Liner (optional)
- Zipper foot (optional I do not use one.)

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS: PLEASE HAVE ALL THE CUTTING DONE BEFORE YOU COME TO CLASS

1. We will provide iron-on vinyl. Please contact Cindy Morgan, hsuccindy@gmail.com or 254-368-9224, before the class date with the width and length of your cut bag so I can have the vinyl cut to save on class time.

(For future reference: Cut 2 pieces of the vinyl at least 1" larger than the bag width and length. For example: Bag is 9" wide x 12" long. Cut the vinyl 10" wide x 13" long.)

2. Lay the bag flat and smooth out as best as possible. Using a rotary cutter and ruler, cut close to all four edges of the bag to separate the front from the back. Front and back need to be the same width and length.

- 3. Cut 2 pieces of lining fabric the same size (width and length) as the bag.
- 4. Cut 2 pieces of batting the same size (width and length) as the bag.
